Dear Parents,

The following are the summer requirements for the fourth grade class of 2014-2015.

**<u>Reading:</u>** All students must read <u>Ben and Me: An Astonishing Life of Benjamin Franklin by His Good Mouse Amos</u> by Robert Lawson; and <u>Journey to Ellis Island: How My Father Came to America</u> by Carol Bierman. In addition, students will choose **one** other book, within their individual Lexile Range<sup>\*</sup>, from the following list:

<ul> <li>Lexile 550-650:</li> <li>Encyclopedia Brown by Donald J. Sobol</li> <li>The Good, the Bad and the Goofy by Jon Scieszka</li> <li>My Life Among the Aliens by Gail Gauthier</li> <li>The Whipping Boy by Sid Fleishman</li> </ul>
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\* PLEASE NOTE: Your child's individual Lexile range can be found on TerraNova Home Report. Assessments and reading projects will be assigned the first week of school.

## Math:

Summer Math Packet - The Summer Math Packet will be available for download on the school website soon (<u>http://</u><u>www.assumptioncatholicschool.net</u>). The purpose of the packet is to review basic multiplication facts. As parents, you should correct and initial each page **as your child completes it** so as not to reinforce errors. Each child who completes this packet and returns it by the end of the first week of school will be given a grade of 100% for the first test grade.

## Writing:

*My Summer Adventures Journal*- using the journal provided, students are required to write and date one (1) journal entry each week. Each journal entry must be 6-12 complete sentences in length and written in their <u>best cursive</u> writing. Students are asked to write about their adventures and thoughts during the summer months. Topics may include - movies they have seen, games they have played, or people and places they have visited.

## Acellus:

Each child has received his/her username and password for Acellus. Each student has access to at least four courses (reading, math, science, social studies). Each course would take about 2 hours per week to complete in 10 weeks. It is STRONGLY RECOMMENDED that students work on the new program, progress will be monitored.

## Reading Rewards:

Each child has been assigned an account on Reading-Rewards.com. Please refer to attached materials for information about how to get started. Next year, mandatory goals will be set at 15-20 minutes/day for reading. Please take the time during the summer to familiarize yourself with how reading rewards works, create your personalized avatar and log your minutes.
