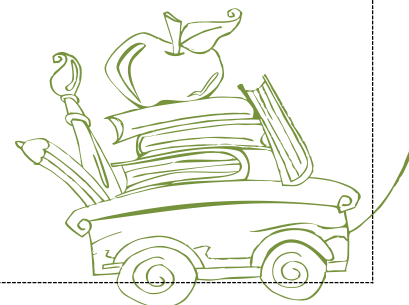
Lastly, MAP testing starts the first week of February and more information will be coming your way.

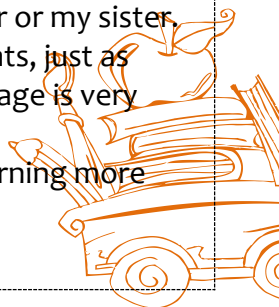
