More and more research shows that our children are experiencing higher levels of stress, anxiety, and depression than in past generations. The daily factors contributing to this sharp rise are not going away any time soon. It is almost impossible to control every factor creating increased distress. We can help our children by teaching them about their emotions and how to cope with them in safe and healthy ways.

We use read aloud in school to teach children how to follow rules in class, use comprehension strategies, and become better writers. We will also use read-aloud texts to teach children about their feelings and how to manage them in a healthy way. Books are a great resource to start discussions with students about all kinds of difficult situations, emotions, feelings, and problems. If your child comes to you, talking about some of the fun books we are reading - listen to them and let them know that understanding, managing, and coping with our feelings is very important.

Lenten Obligations so that our church may be spiritually one in a common observance of Lent, the following obligations are to be observed by all Catholics who enjoy the blessings of good health: • The days of fast and abstinence are Clean Monday, the first day of Lent and Good Friday. • All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. • The obligation of fast applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59. • Fasting in the Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal and two smaller meals which together are not equal to a full meal, so as to experience hunger. • The obligation of abstinence applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of 14. Abstinence in the Catholic tradition means to abstain from meat.

In response to the tragic humanitarian crisis in Ukraine, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary parish in Perth Amboy, NJ of the Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy of Philadelphia recently purchased an ambulance to help save the lives of Ukrainians. With the assistance of Bishop Hryhoriy Komar, Auxiliary Bishop of Sambir-Drohobych Eparchy in Ukraine, an ambulance has been purchased in Italy with the donation from the Medical Career Institute, NY and proceeds from the New Year's Dance (Zabava) fundraiser that took place in the parish on December 31, 2022. An ambulance for Ukraine as it defends itself against Russia's invasion was purchased for 13,000 euros (\$14,500) and was delivered to the city of Kramatorsk, eastern Ukraine for the A7015 Tank Brigade.
